

CHIP-INS & BIRDIES EVENT

Description:

Because a chip-in or birdie is a worthy achievement, we keep track of those made during recognized WGG events and award win.

Following any regular, special or major tournament each WGG member who scores a chip-in or birdie is invited to record the accomplishment on their index card in the "Birdies" or "Chip-Ins" box which will be available at the scorer's table or podium during the post-event luncheon. Each entry must be attested by a WGG playing partner.

At the end of the year, birdie and chip-in entries are tabulated from each player's index cards and separate awards are presented to the members who have accumulated the most birdies and the most chip-ins throughout the year (January-November).

Duties of the Tournament Chair:

1. In December, create and print labels with each WGG member's name (last name, first name) and apply to lined 3" x 5" index cards using different colored cards for each event. Place the cards alphabetically by members' last names in the appropriate Birdies and Chip-ins boxes.
2. Prior to January, confirm the Birdies and Chip-ins budget with the Captain. (Note: A separate annual budget is established for Pro Points, Putts, Birdies and Chip-ins.)
3. After each competition, announce the names of the participants who accomplished a birdie or chip-in at that day's luncheon.
4. Immediately following the final regular tournament day in November, develop spreadsheets identifying the number of birdies and chip-ins entered on each member's index card; formulate each list (most to least) to determine the member standings.¹
5. Considering the funds allocated, work with the Captain to determine the number of awards and the prize amounts¹ (past years have used six flights); develop a written list of winners, places and award amounts.
6. If designated by the Captain, announce and present the awards at the Annual Awards Luncheon.

¹ Per 2008 BOD Decision: "To make the flights as equal as possible divide the number of players by the number of flights. Do not divide like handicaps into separate flights (i.e., keep all same handicaps in the same flight even if the numbers are not equal.)"
