

## PUTTING AWARD

### **Description:**

The annual Putting Tournament is a year-long, 18-hole stroke-play event. As closely as possible, a Putting competition will be scheduled once each month (usually in conjunction with Pro Points, Closest-to-Pin and WGANC events).

On the day of the monthly event, the number of putting strokes<sup>1</sup> made by each player for each hole is recorded on a separate line on the official tournament card. Players competing in this annual Putting Tournament must have competed in at least five of the established putting events between January and November.

A record of each player's overall putt strokes is maintained throughout the year by the Tournament Chair. At the close of the tournament in November, the Tournament Chair will calculate the lowest five qualified putting rounds for each player. At the Annual Awards Luncheon in December, awards will be presented to the participant having the fewest putts overall, as well as to the participant(s) in each flight having the fewest putts (including ties).

<sup>1</sup> Qualifying putting strokes do not need to be made consecutively. All strokes initiated on the putting green must be counted as a putt. If a putt is made and the ball stops on any location off the green (including the fringe), the next stroke would NOT be counted as a putt. The putt count resumes once the ball comes to rest on the green again and continues until the ball is holed.
